Message from Rev. Dr. Carl Heick

Dear friends

These recent weeks have seen the arrival of unprecedented natural disasters. Hurricanes Harvey and Irma, coupled with the fierce fires in the west and the powerful earthquake in Mexico are reminders of how fragile and vulnerable are our circumstances at any time. The toll taken by fellow humans in the face of these natural disasters is mirrored in the untold suffering inflicted by human beings on one another through crime, terrorism and war. We are prone to ask once again, "Why do bad things happen to good people?" I certainly have no easy answer to this question.

Some years ago, Rabbi Harold Kushner, whose young son struggled with a degenerative disease, wrote a book with just that title. In part, his answer was that God was unable to thwart some of the worst which comes our way. That response has never seemed adequate to me. The question arises, is the world of the Bible familiar with natural and man made disaster? Did Jesus encounter tragedy and the questions it provokes in His ministry?

Of course there is the story of Novak and the flood. Paul was shipwrecked in a violent storm though he survived. Jesus exhibits awareness of sudden disaster in Luke 13. He speaks of the brutal slaughter ordered by Pontus Pilate of Jewish worshippers in the Jerusalem temple. He notes the death of those crushed by a collapsing tower which guarded the water system. He understood that such things do happen. He also knew that many tended to blame the victims as if these tragedies were there own fault because of their sin. He clearly states that the victims were not responsible for what happened. He does not attempt to explain why God would allow these things to happen. Rather, He calls us to turn our lives around (this is what it means to repent) and seek the kingdom of God. He calls us to be a blessing to one another even in the face of disaster. God's kingdom involves care for the least powerful and most vulnerable among us. Have we not already seen this kind of concern for our neighbor in the midst of the recent storms.

Jesus himself was no stranger to personal tragedy. He was tortured and brutally executed. It was not his fault. He uttered several memorable words while he hung on the cross. He honestly cried, My God, my God why have you forsaken me? He was human like us. However He did not forsake His Father. Having asked forgiveness for His tormentors, He said, Father, into thy hands I commend my spirit. We don't have all the answers to suffering but we so have a Savior who has walked that path before us and triumphed.
